More painting has been done in the sanctuary and paint has been purchased to do the outside entrance. Shrubs have been trimmed and more will be done this fall.

The big project that B&G has been working on is updating the heating system. Quotes have been received from five companies, now reduced to the top three. The Finance Committee reviewed the quotes and made a recommendation to go with the lowest bid, purchase a new boiler and extend the hot water system in the sanctuary. This will get rid of the old hot air system, leaving just one unit to maintain. This recommendation was passed along to the Building & Grounds Committee; a vote was taken and passed unanimously to accept the recommendations of the Finance Committee. These two decisions/votes were passed along to the Council for its approval and will be presented to the congregation for final approval Sunday, August 26, following the 9:30 service. - Sheldon Goodine, Chair,


