Shelter and Rosie tells me there is always a need for personal supplies for the children & adults, as well as art supplies for the children: sketch pads or construction paper, paints, a variety of sizes of paint brushes.

support to those who have given so much for us and this is an easy way to help. Also, those who knit the beautiful prayer shawls for cancer patients - keep up the good work.

Buildings & Grounds:

Finance & Stewardship:

As Deacon of Finance, I continue to learn and adjust as to how we do things. We have adopted a modest budget for this year. Thank you for your interest, questions, and support at the Annual Meeting. Our biggest expenses so far this year are sanding and SNOW PLOWING! There is not much we can do about that.

I want to thank you all once again for your very generous pledges. Based on your pledges, we are anticipating a significant increase in income in that area. While it might come with a decrease in loose offerings, it is helpful to know and be able to plan ahead. If you ordered envelopes for your pledge offerings, you should have found an "Initial Offering" envelope at the front of the box. This initial offering is separate from the amount you pledged and is a contribution to help cover the cost of purchasing the envelopes. The cost to us amounts to about \$2 per box.

The Council voted to purchase a computer for Paul. We allocated \$250 for the purpose and received a very generous donation of another \$200 toward the cost. So he now has a laptop to use in his work!



We have closed the savings account and moved the funds from it into the Memorial Account to pay back part (\$3,858.57) of the

\$8000 we borrowed last year to balance the budget. Our balances as of Jan 31 are:
