With Labor Day arriving, our China community will quiet down dramatically. We will miss the hustle & bustle of all the visitors passing through. This year holds a record for my




household. I have never had so many visitors come visit in such a short time! We also had a record number of visitors at our church.

## **President's Report:**

The Council continues to meet monthly to discuss the finances, education, worship, maintenance, benevolence, & fundraising events for our church.

We have seen some more new faces & we have had some friends leave, either into God's Kingdom or to another location. In an effort to get the word out a little more, we are looking to schedule more events like Pastor Paul's bow making classes, have more community events like the Paul Sullivan concert this past June, a craft fair in October, our traditional turkey pie suppers, etc. If anyone has any ideas about skills they could teach some night or additional fundraising ideas, please see someone on the Council or attend one of our Council meetings. They are held the second Tuesday of every month & begin at 6:30 PM.

#### Missions & Benevolence:

Budget: \$2,550.00 Expenses: \$1,031.65 Balance \$1,518.35

In April, we received a \$1,000 anonymous donation for the needy. Since the Benevolence Committee had voted to transition our two families to the China Food Pantry for food needs, it was agreed that this donation would go into the Pastor's Discretionary Fund to be used for the emergency requests he so often receives. As of May, both families stopped receiving monthly food from SCCC & were to use the weekly program at the Food Pantry.

In June, we were saddened to hear of the death of the mother in "Family #1." The Benevolence Committee approved a check for \$200 to be issued & sent to the Scholarship Fund established for her son at the Camden National Bank.



In June, we sent \$50 to the two teens who were raising funds for the mission trip to El Salvador. An anonymous donor also sent personal

checks to each of the teens. A very heartfelt thank-you note was received from the teens & was read to the congregation.

On July 31<sup>st</sup> we had a "Bring a Can Sunday" to help fill the emergency food container with non-perishable foods that Pastor Paul or Rosie can use for emergency calls.

As announced in the August 7<sup>th</sup> Church Bulletin, we are currently accepting donations (as well as use funds from our M&B budget) to purchase gift certificates for school clothes for the children in Families #1 & #2. I am still hoping to bring some music into the program, but would need all the children there on a regular basis. It would be nice to have the children perform some day.

The rooms are still in need of reorganizing & sorting through materials. The summer has gone by extremely fast! I do have a few new sets of markers & a couple tins of crayons. I should be able to get the cloth & yarn needed for Sunday School from the donation made by Debbie Stowe. Tape, glue, Expo markers & eraser, glitter, whiteout, & other craft items will be purchased before school starts up.

Child Care has gone rather well. A list for the second half of the year was passed out to the volunteers. Another person has also stepped up to help for a couple of weeks & that was greatly appreciated.

## **Worship Committee:**

Have we sung your favorite hymn lately? I do keep a list of what hymns we have done & when so that we don't repeat too often. Of course, there are favorites that just can't be resisted! We try to choose a mix of music &



occasionally throw in a completely new hymn; some are more successful than others. It's easy to overlook good choices, so please let me know if you have a suggestion.

Many of you have heard Pastor Paul mention the *Common Lectionary*, from which the Scripture passages included in our service are drawn. When I started as Worship Chair, I did not know what it was, so did a bit of research.

Within Christianity, the use of pre-assigned, scheduled readings from the scriptures can be traced back to the early church & seems to have been inherited from Judaism. The Revised Common Lectionary, which is used here, was adopted in 1994 by many churches & many denominations throughout the world. Readings for each Sunday include a passage from the Old Testament, a passage from one of the Psalms, another from the Epistles or Book of Revelation & finally, one from the Gospels. The Lectionary runs in three-year cycles (we are currently in Year C); the gospel readings in the first year (Year A) are taken from the Gospel of Matthew; those in the second year (Year B) from the Gospel of Mark, & in the third year (Year C), from the Gospel of Luke. Portions of the Gospel of John are read throughout the Easter season & also at other times. The idea behind the lectionary is that in any given year, the writer of one of the first three gospels will be heard from beginning to end. Likewise, the rest of the New Testament is heard, in some cases, virtually in total, in others in large part. (Note: information from Wikipedia)

We are very blessed to have this beautiful church & to be able to worship freely. I am always amazed when I think of how many people are involved with the operation of this church. # Finance & Stewardship:

#### Balances as of 7/31/2016:

Since July 31, we have had a Turkey Pie Supper, Chicken BBQ, & Rummage Sale, all of which were very successful & brought in some welcome funds. Even still, we are about \$4,000 short of our income goal. We will be having two more turkey pie suppers, one in September & one in October, & Debbie is resurrecting the craft fair to be held on October 1st. Those events should help bring in some more revenue.

We did not use our allotted 6% of the Meader Fund last year, so Ron, who is in charge of Buildings & Grounds, used some of it to buy an air conditioner for the sanctuary. It has been appreciated with the hot summer we have had & will also serve as a dehumidifier for downstairs.

Our expenses are pretty much on target. We have spent about 65% of our budget after



eight months, which is just about right. As always, I thank you for your generous support & loyalty to our wonderful church family. -Respectfully, Finance Chair, BUDGET Janet Preston

# **REFLECTIONS & PREDICTIONS** PART III (The Good News)

Hear the good news! "In the beginning was God and at the end will be God, and in every moment in between, there is God's creating, redeeming and sustaining us."

How are we to believe the good news? It is through faith. Faith in God, the Son & the Holy Spirit. Untold numbers of people have lost faith for a host of reasons. We need to reverse this trend & return to faith in God. How do we do this? The challenges are many, but I believe the pendulum is starting to come back to a more uplifting life.

Family: The backbone of Christian living is now making a slow comeback. We are seeing less single-parent homes & more traditional two-parent homes that love & nurture their children. This can be a big step forward.

Politics: We can help change the status quo by asking every candidate for office if he or she is a practicing Christian or a member of any religion with moral values. Do this from candidates running for local town officials to the president of the USA. Now is the time to push forward. We can change the nature of politics from "me" to "we." This will jump start us to becoming a more Christian country.

We must put the brakes on being politically correct. Why let a handful of folks dictate to us where & when we can pray? Where & when we can fly the flag of the United States? What can we as Christians do to improve on the downward slide of society?
