#### Finance & Stewardship:

After the first three months of 2023, I have to say a big thank you again! Our average contributions from pledges & loose offerings are above the target to meet the budget. Our income so far from

pledges is \$3,220 & from loose offerings is \$1,336.50. Each of these is above where it should be a quarter of the way through the year. Thank you!

Overall, we have brought in \$16,970, which is 25% of our budgeted revenue for the year. Expenses currently total about \$16,400, which is about 21% of the budget, so we are right on target for both expenses & revenue. We got a reprieve on our propane when CB Haskell called to say we have a large credit in our account & that we are all set until the new prices come out in June. That was wonderful news!

We have also collected over \$1,000, or about 51%, of our budgeted PDF money, thanks to Susie's treats & your generosity.
